

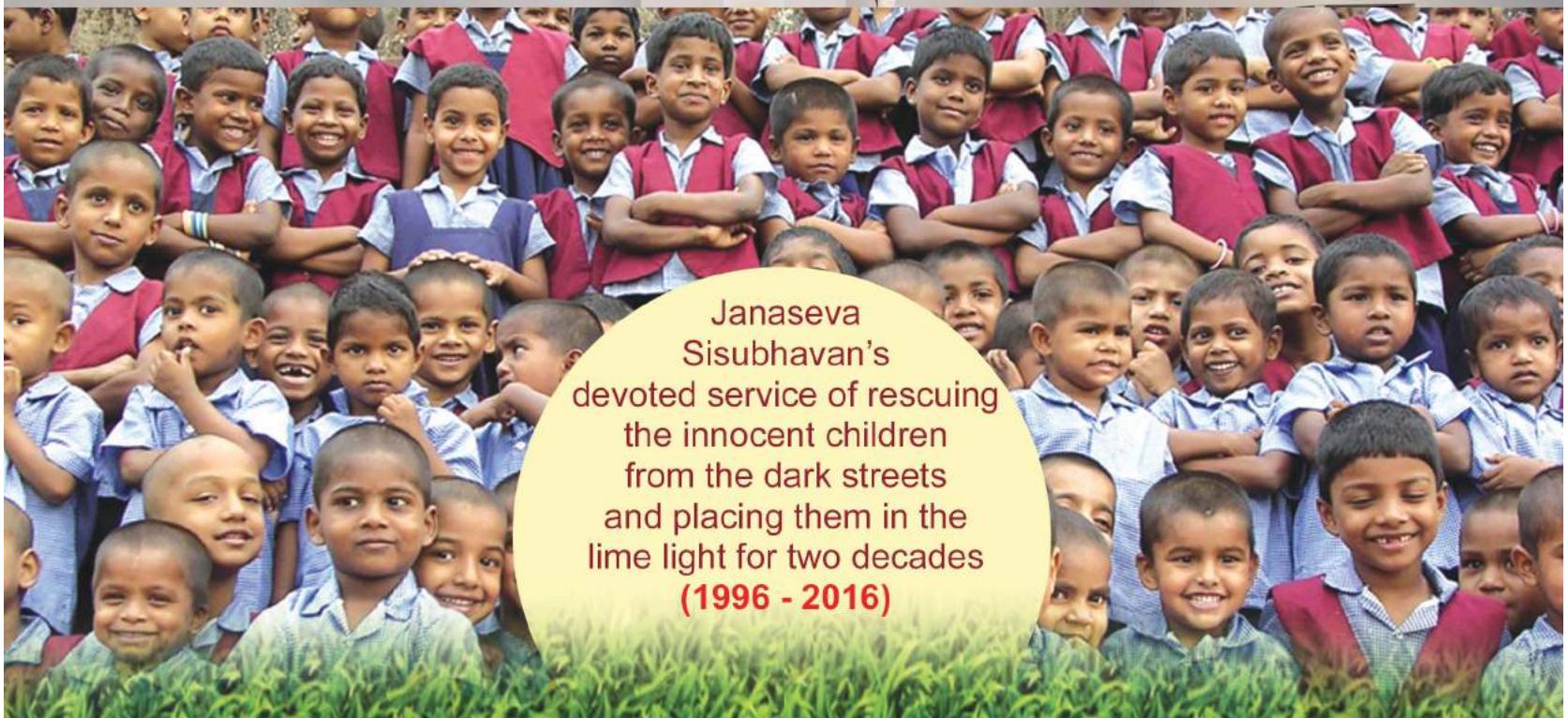

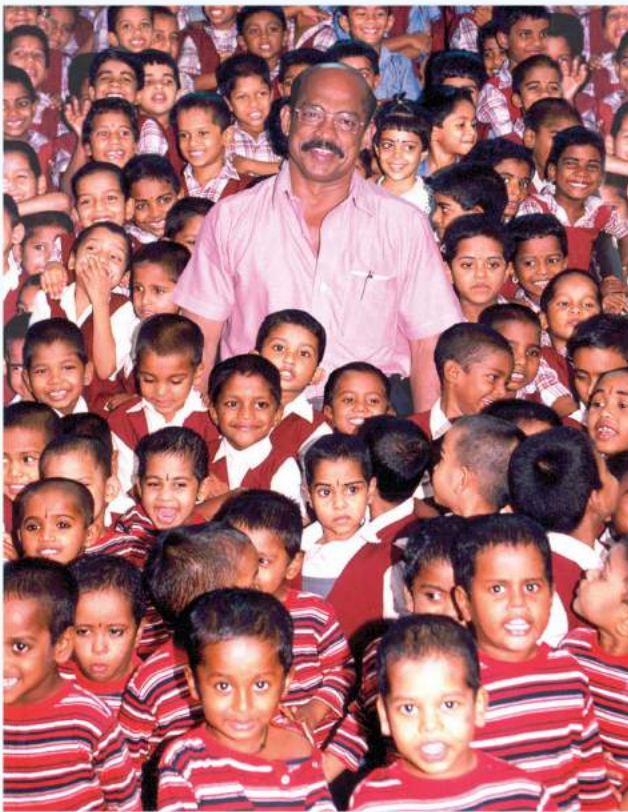

# Mission & Vision

## A Heaven for the Orphan Children



Adieu to the sufferings and struggles of the orphan children who fight with the street dogs and die. Here is a place for them to live in love and happiness. When Ex-Governor Sugh dev Singh inaugurated Janaseva sisibhavan in 1999 February 21, similar to the orphanage established by Mother Theresa, was taking shape in Kerala. The new building of Janaseva Sisubhavan in the settlement colony in Aluva has the infrastructure and facility to house more than five hundred children. This institution is born out of the brain of Mr. Jose Mavely hail from Karukutty.

An unexpected event in Mr. Jose's life paved the way for this venture. 24 years back, while going back to his home, he saw a woman with

a small child in her hand drowning in the flooded canal. Without a second thought he rescued the woman but to his shock he realized that the woman was not committing suicide but trying to kill that small child. She was a psychic patient. Mr. Jose admitted that mother in a mental asylum in Thrissur. Next problem was what to do that two year old child? He travelled length and breadth of Kerala to put that child in an orphanage. He realized the shortages of orphanages and decided to start one with that one child!!!



## Now in Popular demand, the stray-dog hunter of Kerala

Before being called on to handle dog menace, Jose Maveli rescued children from streets, provided them shelter and education

BROUGHT UP in orphanage during his schooldays Jose Maveli launched himself as a social worker two decades ago by rescuing children living on the streets from criminals.

Maveli, now 66, is back on the streets, thistime to hunt down stray dogs, When his phone rings, it sounds the death knell for a dog somewhere.

Stray dogs have become a major sacre in Krala, with countless people having been bitten and some even killed. Many are turing to Maveli for help. He claims he already faces eight criminal cases peraining to killing of street dogs. Not that these deter him from hunting down and killed more dogs.

"Everyday, I am getting several calls from people and village governing bodies to catch stray dogs. I have killed 2,000-odd stray dogs during the ongoing crises." said Maveli, leader of a "stray dog-free movement" in the state. On Monday, he was at Kadunga floor village panchayath, where people's representatives had called him to get rid of stray dogs.

Now based in Kochi, Maveli was born at Karukutty in Ernakulam district. His parents could not afford to educate him and sent him to an orphanage in Alappuzha, where he lived until Class X. After studying a technical course. Maveli went back home, initially helped his parents in farming, and went on to become a wholesale rice merchant. Along the way, he joined the CPM worker and became vice-president of Karukutty panchayath in 1987.

His activism for homeless children began in the 1990s. "I was

moved by the plight of children living on the streets." Maveli said. "When a homeless woman gave birth to a child on the street at Aluva. I approached an orphanage seeking to adopt it, but they tumed me down as she was not form Kerala."

In 1996, he started distibuting free

cially supported Sisubhavan. We have rescued 2,000 children from streets over the years; 300 are still in hostels under Sisubhavan." he said.

Toady, the new assignment has brought Maveli out on the streets again. He gathers local volounteers who trap stray dogs and stragle them

food to children. Three years later, he launched Janaseva Sisuhavan o provide food, shelter and education for children rescued form the streets. In 2008, the organisation launched a sports academy for the inmates. "These children are deprived of emotional and psychologocal support of a family. I realised it was our responsibility to bring them up in a homely amosphere." Maveli said.

Over the years, residents of Sisu bhavan have made news. "Some of the children had participated in district, state and national sports competitions. Two former residents, Velmurugan and Raja, who were resued from beggars, have found jobs in banks under sports quota." Maveli said.

The venture gets help from donors. "Around 10,000 people have finan-

with a rope. While this has shocked animal rights activists in Kerala and away. Maveli said the "Stray dog-free movement" is determined to kill all street dogs.

Straydogs have attacked several people in Kerala, primarily in cities, over the last few months. Among the latest victims was Charuvila Raghavan, 90, maules to death by a pack of dogs in Thiruvananthapuram in October. In August, a 68-year-old woman had been killed in a coastal village.

Amid reports of culling, Union WCD Minister Maneka Gandhi made a statement recently that Kerala should invoke its antigoons law against those responsible. On the ground, however, Kerala Social Welfare Minister K.T. Jaleel and even the state BJP responded that the crisis justifies the culling.

KOCHI, INDIA — The dog catcher tiptoes into a narrow lane carrying a metal wire snare. Someone had spotted a stray dog amid rows of coconut trees a few minutes ago.

“Finish that dog today,” one woman calls out from her porch. Another says the dog killed half the ducks in his farm. A third complains the dog has been growling at his 10-year-old son all week. When he corners the skinny brown dog and tightens the wire around its neck, residents cheer and turn on their cellphone cameras. A few minutes later, he pulls out five puppies from under a log pile and stuffs them into a tight plastic bag. All the animals will eventually be killed.

In recent months, people in the southern Indian state of Kerala have declared a war on dogs.

Hundreds of street dogs have been killed in the past year across a state that calls itself “God’s own country,” and is a tourist magnet. Mobs routinely beat dogs to death or hire professional catchers to do the job. Recently a group of men killed several dogs and paraded through the streets with carcasses strung on a pole, dumping them in front of a public building.

The bitter man-canine conflict here has alarmed animal lovers across India and drawn sharp criticism from the country’s Supreme Court, which said this month that although dogs cannot become a “menace to society,” widespread killing was unacceptable.

“We want Kerala’s streets to be free of stray dogs,” said Jose Maveli, who runs a home for street children and is founder of the Stray Dogs Eradication Society in the state. A key patron of the anti-street dog drive here, he pays for 10 dog catchers in the city, who killed 300 dogs last year. He thinks that the roaming strays — about 250,000 in the state, according to estimates — endanger public safety and hurt the economy.

“Look at the Western countries, are there dogs roaming so freely on the street?” he said. “Every day young children and elderly people are getting bitten.”

Street dogs are a common nuisance all over India, with many who feed them but do not adopt them as pets. Public sterilization programs exist, but many are underfunded, and India’s laws do not allow for humane euthanasia for dogs. India has about 30 million stray dogs, and reported about 20,000 human deaths from rabies — mostly of poor people and children — in 2014.

In Kerala, more than 100,000 incidents of dog bites were reported last year, up from 88,000 the previous year. The state reported less than a dozen rabies deaths, and it does not have more street dogs than in other Indian states. But this is lost in the emotionally charged atmosphere.

Giant billboards around the city paid for by anti-dog activists show snarling canines and gruesome images of people with bite wounds. Local newspapers chronicle seemingly every dog bite, and run alarmist cartoons depicting blood dripping from the mouths of dogs. In the municipal elections this year in Kerala, voters were urged to elect candidates who promised to kill street dogs. Last week, some school children in Kochi took a pledge to eradicate stray dogs.

The killing drive in Kerala intensified two months ago when an elderly woman died in a coastal town after being attacked by a pack of stray dogs on the beach.

“The politicians, the media and the vigilante groups — they have all got Kerala into a panic mode,” said Latha Indira, an activist with People For Animals in the state. “There is no room for reason or restraint. Animal lovers are on the defensive right now.”

One activist, Aishwarya Prem, said she was pushed to the ground and kicked by an angry mob when she was trying to rescue street dogs late last year.

“When I hear that people are killing a dog, I rush there and take the dog in my arms and ask, ‘Does this really look like an aggressive dog to you?’” Prem said.

Unlike other Indian states, Kerala did not implement neutering programs for street dogs with much conviction after 2001, when a national law mandating sterilization was passed. The government sets aside an average of \$11 per dog on neutering, which officials in other states say is inadequate. Experts say that poor collection of garbage in the cities is the main reason that India has a street dog problem.

In recent years, more and more middle-class Indian families are acquiring pet dogs, but many prefer foreign pedigree dogs instead of Indian street dogs. Residents routinely complain to their municipal corporations about street dogs in their neighborhoods. In a recent video that went viral, a medical student flings a stray puppy off the roof; in another, men are shown burning dogs.

“Dogs in Kerala are in an absolute state of fright because of the killings,” said Sumitha Suseelan, who runs a weekly adoption drive for stray dogs. “They have developed a suspicion of human beings.”

In a Kochi suburb, 7-year old Ayoos Sajimon is slowly recovering from multiple surgeries after a dog bite. Two months ago, a street dog pounced on him, pressed its paws on his chest and bit his face and eye. The dog was killed by neighbors the week after.

“My son is so traumatized that he now runs inside the house every time he hears a dog bark somewhere,” his mother, Bismi, said.

The Supreme Court ordered Kerala to sterilize the street dogs. Kerala residents say they do not have the patience for that.

“People are shouting, ‘Kill them, kill them, kill them,’ but even if you keep killing daily, you can never achieve the zero number,” said Kishore Janardhanan, a veterinary surgeon at a government-run dog birth control hospital in Kochi. “There is no easy, magic solution to the dog menace. The only scientific thing to do is sterilization. But in all this paranoia, our work has been discredited as a soft measure.”

As a child in a Jesuit orphanage, Jose Maveli vowed to work hard so that he never experienced poverty again. As a successful businessman in Aluva, Kerala, many years later, he was still not happy. Every time he saw a hungry child on the streets, he was reminded of his past. In 1996, Maveli launched Janaseva to provide scholarships to poor children. A year later, Janaseva started distributing free lunch to 300 underprivileged children in government schools. The programme was later extended to 600 children. In 1999, Maveli, who had by then quit his business, started Janaseva Sisubhavan, a home for street children and a school. Not content with that, he also set up a football ground and swimming pool. "I wanted to provide world-class facilities to my children, so they could face the world with confidence," says the 61-year-old. Sure enough, four children from his institute are in the district football team, while one led the Kerala sub-junior team in 2010. Maveli now wants one of his children to qualify for the civil services. "I have told them to try. I'm sure they will qualify," he says confidently.

# Kerala's 'dog-killer' won't quit till strays are off the streets

**THIRUVANANTHAPURAM:** Jose Maveli is on a mission to save his home state Kerala from transforming from 'God's own country' into 'dog's own country'.

And his campaign — kill stray dogs and exhort others to do the same in a state where an estimated 2.70 lakh stray canines prowl its towns and cities.

After a man was mauled to death by strays in the state's south last week, he organised the killing of 40 dogs in revenge.

Locals supported his act and foiled his arrest by police.

Maveli, 66, has eight cases

pending against him under the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act.

But an undeterred Maveli has emerged as the public face of the campaign against stray dogs in Kerala.

The state is facing a canine crisis so huge that the matter was recently discussed in the state assembly.

Some 10 people have been mauled to death and there have been 90,000 dog bite cases this year alone.

As a fierce debate rages on to how to resolve the problem — mass culling or sterilisation — Maveli insists it is time for the public to take matters in their own hands.

Anjali Sharma, a member of the state animal welfare

board, accuses Maveli of fear-mongering and provoking people.

Animal lovers of the state liken him to a "demon".

But Maveli insists he is not a killer by choice. "Killing of dogs is for securing the safety of men, women and children in the state," he

says. "We killed many cattle when foot and mouth disease broke out and two years ago in Kuttanad (central Kerala), lakhs of ducks were also culled in the wake of bird flu threat. No cases were registered against anyone then. Why are dogs not killed when they pose grave danger to people?" he asks.

Maveli runs an NGO and claims to have rehabilitated hundreds of abandoned children.

He cites a recent article claiming that the sale of anti-rabies vaccine was a ₹7,000-crore business in India.

"Kerala is their biggest market. They want strays to multiply so that their business will thrive," he alleges.

The boy has been identified as Veeraz. Veeranna-Subbamma couple from Andhra Pradesh claimed that he was their eldest son. Subbamma finds the livelihood for the family by beg-

ging with her two younger children, keeping Veeraz tied to a tree, she revealed. The local residents who found the pathetic condition of Veeraz, informed the Janaseva Sisubhavan officials who saved the boy with the help of Jose Thettayil MLA and SI Joy Mathew.

Veeraz was admitted to the Aluva Government Hospital. Legal sanction for the permission to take care of the boy would be sought soon, Janaseva president Jose Mavely said. •ENS

**Activists to seek Supreme Court's intervention**

Jose Maveli, chairman of Janaseva Sisubhavan and leader of Anti-Stray Dog Movement, Kochi, talks about the stray dog menace in the city.

“We are planning to file a petition before the Supreme Court on the tragic death of Shiluvamma, 65, who succumbed to the deep injuries she sustained in the attack by a large pack of dogs at Kanjirakulam in Thiruvananthapuram on Saturday. Janaseva Sisubhavan will seek the apex court's immediate intervention in controlling the stray dog menace, which has already turned dangerous and life-threatening. Only the poor and the helpless are getting attacked by dogs. We have learnt that at least 10 cases of dog biting are reported in various government hospitals in Ernakulam daily. The government is not acting tough against the menace despite several incidents in which innocents were

severely injured. Animal birth control measures have not yielded any results.

“Who will speak for those on the streets, who live under the threat of stray dogs. They do not even know where to complain and how to stop this menace. Animal lovers should also realise that it's the human lives that you are all playing with by opposing culling of stray dogs that attack human beings. Are you ready to protect these animals? If you are ready, we will come forward and bring these animals to your doorstep. We are ready to hand over these stray dogs to the local bodies, if the panchayats, municipalities, and corporations are ready to provide them shelters. But no government body has come forward yet to take responsibility of these animals”

Trade Union workers in Angamaly happened to see a sweet girl wrapped in an old cloth laid on the road side. A man sitting near her is greedily looking for the coins people throw towards this child. Workers caught him and questioned him. Initially he said the child got burn from hot water; fell into the hearth and all. His name is Perumal. He later admitted the truth that he poured acid on her legs and got burned in order to get sympathy while begging. Workers informed Janaseva sisubhavan and Mr. Jose Mavelly reached there, rescued the child and admitted in the Anwar hospital aluva. After one month treatment she regained her health. Now she is studying in the English medium school and very active in extracurricular activities like dance, music and sports. When she moves around Janaseva sisubhavan with her smiling face and glittering eyes, nobody will think of the sad plight she has undergone.

While narrating her terrific experiences of life that 11 year old girl's eyes reflected the agony, stress and torture she has undergone. They come at midnight hours in a car. They make her father and step mother drink till they lose consciousness. Then closing her mouth they carry her to the nearby bush and three or four of them gang raped her and tortured her. Her mother used to say her sister Lakshmi had the same fate and they killed her. Her father Murugan had beaten her mother and sister away. Now, the second wife Rani is with him. She is a cruel and drunken woman. She recalls she has two siblings named Manikandan and sangetha, the former one in Taminadu and the latter in Thrissur. Her father in her step mother Rani has three children namely Venkatesh, Ponnammal and Devu. They are in Kerala from their early childhood. In the morning these children were clothed in worn dresses and send to begging. Till evening they should roam and beg and the money they collect will be shared by her father and step mother. They eat and drink and fall asleep. At this point of time those anti social people will reach there .Her voice shivered and eyes welled up with tears while explaining her trauma. When she fall asleep due to hunger these people will take her far away and gang raped. This happened repeatedly and she suffered because she doesn't have the strength to resist. There is no provision to keep grown up girls in sisubhavan. So she was handed over to Abhaya, an institution run by the renowned poet Sugathakumari. Mr. Jose Mavelly rescued her from Ernakulam while she was begging in front of Thevara Loordh church.

## Janaseva rescued Aradhana from Begger Mafia - 2003

On December 12th 2003 Aradhana got release from the cruel hands of beggar mafia. When Janaseva rescued the child, her body had full of nail pinch marks. At the age of 4 along with her mother she went to a temple festival and from there the beggar mafia kidnapped her. She spoke only English language. What we have understood from her is that her house is in Raichur, in Karnataka and her father's name is Chandrasekhar and mother's name is Madhu. In order to submit a memo randum to the Chief Minister to wipe out child begging, Mr. Jose mavelly reached Trivandrum. Near the railway station these two children Aradhana and Pushpa, were begging in a pathetic way. He rescued those children and taken them to Sisubhavan. The very next day a group of 10 people of Andhra Pradesh natives, including Bassanna and Sungamma reached Janaseva and claimed for their release as they are the parents of Aradhana and Pushpa. Sisubhavan authorities produced the children in front of them. Seeing the gang Aradhana started crying and howling as if she saw some terrific creatures and ran into Sisubhavan. Pushpa identified her mother from the group and expressed her willingness to go with mother. In further investigation revealed the truth that Anuradha is a kidnapped child and Pushpa is their own child. Sisubhavan's president Jose Mavelly filed case against them and the police arrested Bassanna and Sugunamma. We tried our level best to locate Aradhana's parents but failed.

# From pauper to prince, Raja aims for the king's throne

NOT TOO long ago, young Chinnaswamy Raja's world revolved around the Shaktan Thapuram bus stand in Thrissur where the six-year-old would push his leper father on a trolley, begging for alms. Today, at 14, he is part of the Kerala sub-junior team and caught the eye in the National sub-junior Championships in Punjab with a couple of stunning strikes.

Born in Salem, Tamil Nadu, Raja and his father moved to Thrissur in search for a better life in 2002, but could manage nothing better than one on the streets, begging. And if that was not bad enough, the begging mafia directed Raja to cough up Rs. 100 everyday, or lose his father. One day, Raja could cough up only Rs 50 for the day. "The ringleader rubbed chilly powder into my eyes and brandished a hot iron rod close to my eyes. He wanted to make an example out of me," Raja says, recalling the horror.

However, finally Raja had some luck. He was rescued from the clutches from the mafia and put into an orphanage called Sisu Bhavan. The joy was fleeting, though. Raja lost his father and was forced to deal with the trauma of his begging days on his own.

It was in football that Raja found a friend. "He would

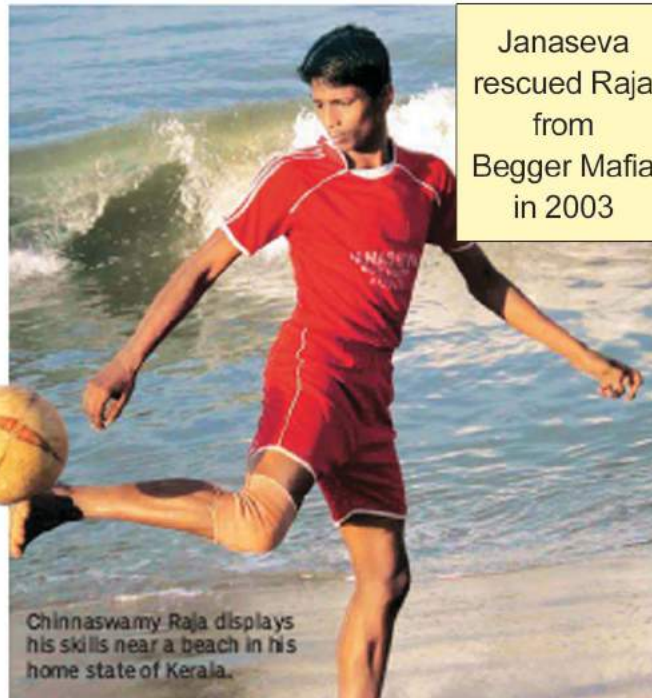
spend hours on end kicking a ball on his own, almost putting all of his energy into the game, trying to forget everything else," says Jose Marvell, the president of Sisu Bhavan.

"He has superb ball control and amazing power. I am sure he will be in the national junior team in a couple of years. He needs good training," his coach, former India international Soli Xavier says about Raja.

"I have heard about this little

player. I'll be meeting him one of these days. I was told he's technically very sound. I'll be happy to give some him a few," says I M Vjayan, who like Raja, grew up amidst hardships in Thrissur, selling soda bottles.

"Many people have helped me reach this far and I will not let anyone down," Raja says with sincerity. And knowing the road he has had to tread to get this far, Raja should stay true to his promise.

Velmurukan from Beggar Mafia - 2003**

Velmurukan was born in a slum called sithannur, in Tamilnadu. He has one younger sister and was taken care by his uncle and paternal mother. They were told that parents died in their early age. This uncle are addicted to alcohol and drugs. He used to torture physically and abuse them cruelly. One day this cruel uncle handed over this boy to Dharmarajan head of the beggar's mafia. Velmurukan says uncle exchanged him to Dharmarajan from the Aluva railway station. There after he has not seen his uncle. Dharmarajan took this boy to a beggar's gang. There like him 10 other children were sending to begging. Money they get out of begging should be given to Dharmaraja. Velmurukan felt tremendous loneliness and was searching his uncle. In the night when Dharmaraja reached, fully drunken, asked for money. Velmurukan said he has not gone for begging and he has no money to give. He violently dragged the boy through the darkness towards the nearest railway track and started beating him. when he cried aloud he threatened he will kill and took out a can form his bag and poured the acid over the boy's body and thrown him to an empty goods cabin. To burn him he lit the body with the cigar lighter.

**A lonely battle for life**

**R**OOM 19 at K ward of the Medical Trust Hospital has a special patient. Very special, because the patient is critical and has none to care.

The story of a badly burnt seven-year-old Tamil boy was splashed in some newspapers a few days ago. Yet, no one has turned up to claim his guardianship or parentship. Squirring in pain, and battling for life, Velmurukan is still unable to tell what exactly happened to him.

Maybe he remembers the incident, but his burns have partly sealed his mouth. It seems the fire which ravaged his torso and limbs has had some mercy on Velmurukan. His unburnt dorsal portion allows him to lie on his back, with almost the entire body saving the head dressed to prevent exposure to infection.

The hospital authorities say the boy had suffered over 50 per cent burns, which was good enough to threaten his life. Though critical, his survival chances look bright because he has little internal burns.

The boy on Sunday mumbled that his father was Raja and mother Sumati. What happened to him will remain a mystery until he speaks about it. His mutterings like "rail... current... net" can lead one to believe that the boy was electrocuted when he wandered into a railway electric line at Aluva.

But the doctors who treat him find it hard to believe this. The nature of his burns, according to hospital authorities, shows that they were caused by some other agent like boiling water or fire.

The officials of Aluva-based Janaseva Sisubhavan, who brought the child to Medical Trust, are doubtful about the burns. It must have been the handiwork of some beggars who inflict injuries on children to legitimise beggary.

The fact that the burnt boy was abandoned by a couple of men at the Taluk Headquarters Hospital at Aluva on April 22 indicates some foul play.

There is fear in his eyes, even when he mutters that he lives in Aluva. Apart from meeting the cost of medicines, Sisubhavan authorities have a man to stand by Velmurukan.

On April 22, 2003, early morning I received a telephone call from Aluva govt. hospital superintendent Dr. M.Vijaya Kumar said somebody discarded a boy burned all over the body in critical condition in the hospital and asked me to rescue the child. Immediately with the help of hospital authorities, in their ambulance the boy was shifted to Ernakulam Medical Trust Hospital and admitted in the ICU. After a week the boy slowly recovered and able to speak out what exactly happened. After two months of hospitalisation he got discharged came to Sisubhavan. Later he joined NSS Parakadavu Higher Secondary School and completed his schooling. By this time he turned to be an excellent football player and in 2008 Velmurugan was elected for the district football team.

# Education project launched for destitute children

Sixty-five boys would benefit from the project. "These boys are mostly from Tamil Nadu, Andhra Pradesh and Karnataka. They were brought here as part of street circus and for begging," he said.

Those at the Janaseva are finding it difficult to provide education to these boys, as most of them do not have even the basic education. "They are being taught in English and Malayalam. We plan to educate them up to matric-

ulation, along with imparting professional training such as computer skills, carpentry and masonry," Mr. Jose said.

The construction of one floor has been completed and the project is expected to be fully operational by December.

The day also witnessed a

Mr. Jose presided over the inaugural session and Sister Christabel, Principal of St. Teresa's College where the function was held, delivered the keynote address. Actor Kaviyoor Ponnamma administered a pledge on 'Protecting street childhood'.

**O**n Saturday, a day before Vishu, six youngsters walked into the office of a textile major on the outskirts of Kochi. For these inmates of Janaseva Sisubhavan, Aluva, it was their first day on the job at Kitex, and the beginning of a new life.

Their mentor Jose Maveli was on cloud nine, as he waited for them to return in the evening.

"This is the best Vishu kaineettam I have ever received. This year we have a reason to celebrate the festival with all grandeur, as eight of our children have landed respectable jobs. While six got the opportunity to work with the textile firm, two joined the Central Bank of India on April 1," said Jose Maveli, who is the president of Janaseva Sisubhavan.

## Boys' Home nearing completion

**Aluva, Dec 31:** Janaseva, a voluntary organisation based in Aluva and committed to - India Without Street Children, is all set to cross yet another milestone in its path of growth with the construction of the Boys' Home. It will be completed by January.

The Boys Home, being constructed in Madurapuram at Mekkad near Aluva, is aimed to cater to the needs of the poor boys who are stranded on streets, engaged in begging, forced to perform in Circuses, exploited sexually and tortured by the so called 'parents', said Janaseva president Jose Maveli. These unfortunate children will be provided

with food, shelter and education. They will be brought to the mainstream of the society, Maveli added. The construction of the three-storeyed main building of the Boys'

Home having 30,000 sq. ft. area, has been almost completed. A basketball court, football ground and swimming pool were constructed near the Boys' Home.

Launched in 1997, the Janaseva runs Sisubhavan, Sneha Veedu, Street India Movement, Amma Veedu and Stthri Sakthi (woman empowerment) units apart from the Boys' Home.

Around 140 girls and boys aged below five years are taken care of in the Janaseva Sisubhavan and 130 boys above the age of five years are sheltered in the Boys' Home. But, now, the Janaseva is in a deep financial crisis, Jose Maveli said.

# Every child wants to be a sporting hero

**MUSCAT:** He is a champion in the purest sense of the word. Not because Jose Maveli is the former champion of the 2004 Asian Masters Athletics Meet but he is also the champion of a social movement in South Indian state of Kerala.

He is the saviour of thousands of street children in India, who have been given home to live and two schools to learn but as Jose is slog-ging hard to run the 'Janaseva Sisubhavan', he says majority of the students at his schools, who are boys want to be a Sachin Tendulkar.

With Kochi all set to play in the Indian Premiere League this year, cricket will be the next big thing in the state which according to Jose can give opportunities to many as-piring talents from the state, which includes cricketers from his own school.

"Long ago it was a different story as Keralites in general were more focussed in academics while sports was a secondary thing but now things have changed and everyone wants to become a cricketer at least to the stature of Sachin Tendulkar," said Jose in an interview with Times Sport.

Jose is in town as part of the charity campaign that is being promoted for welfare of the Janaseva Sisubha-van in Aluva. Around 200 children are being brought up at the Janaseva Sisubhavan (130 boys and 70 girls) and according to Jose, majority of these children have different stories to narrate. "Most of them come from different backgrounds and most of these street kids have their own sto-ries to say," he said.

While cricket is the first prefer-ence for these boys, there are few football lovers as well. "We have a state player in our school while

there are several others who play at the district level," he said.

Former legendary Australian cricketer Steve Waugh had visited the school and supported Jose. "Ste-ve is a great human being.

"He supported us and backed those boys who are playing cricket," he said.

Jose, himself, is an athlete and is the current 100 meters and 200 me-ters champion in the just concluded Kerala meet. He recorded 13 seconds in the 100 meters while won the 200 metre gold in just 27.1 seconds.

His notable moment came at the 2004 Asian Masters Meet in Thai-land when he spectacularly won the gold in the 100 metres race in just 12.3 seconds.

"It was a tough race because there were some of the best athletes from Asia and I never knew I could win gold there but it was a great experi-ence," Jose said.

Thereafter he is a regular par-ticipant of such events. In 2007, he came second in the 200 meters Asia Masters Meet in Thailand and this time last year, he won the bronze in the 400 meters in the Masters Meet in Malaysia.

"To represent your country is a great thing and that is what I am trying to do through my school. I want my children to represent In-

dia in whatever form of sports they choose," he said proudly. But to aid them, he needs Rs 700,000 a month and most of the times he goes bank-rupt.

"I don't know how the money comes but we somehow manage it. Most of the funds come from peo-ple who want to contribute to the

needs of these kids and people who want to be part of this cause," he added. Jose managed to win some support during the recent 'Jayas-andhya' programme and he hopes many well-wishers will come for-ward to support his cause. Jose can be reached at +919895466339 and +914842603379.

# Jose Maveli seeks custody of children

Janaseva Sisubhavan president Jose Maveli has approached the Kerala High Court challenging the direction issued by the Chief Judicial Magistrate, Ernakulam, directing to hand over the custody of three children under his care — Selvi, Kasthuri and Subhashini — to their father Babu, a native of Kadapa in Andhra Pradesh.

Justice K. Hema directed to keep the children at Sisubhavan till Friday. The children, who had been rescued from a wayside circus party run by Babu two-and-a-half years ago, are attending school. The direction of the magistrate to hand over the custody of children to Babu is not in the best interest of the children, Jose Maveli argued.

According to the petitioner, the children were born to Babu in his three wives. Vasanthi, mother of Selvi, 9, died after an accident during a circus performance. Radha, mother of Kasthuri, committed suicide due to the alleged harassment of Babu. Vasantha, mother of Subhashini, deserted the child and her husband unable to suffer torture. The kids were used for circus performance and were tortured by Babu and his mother.

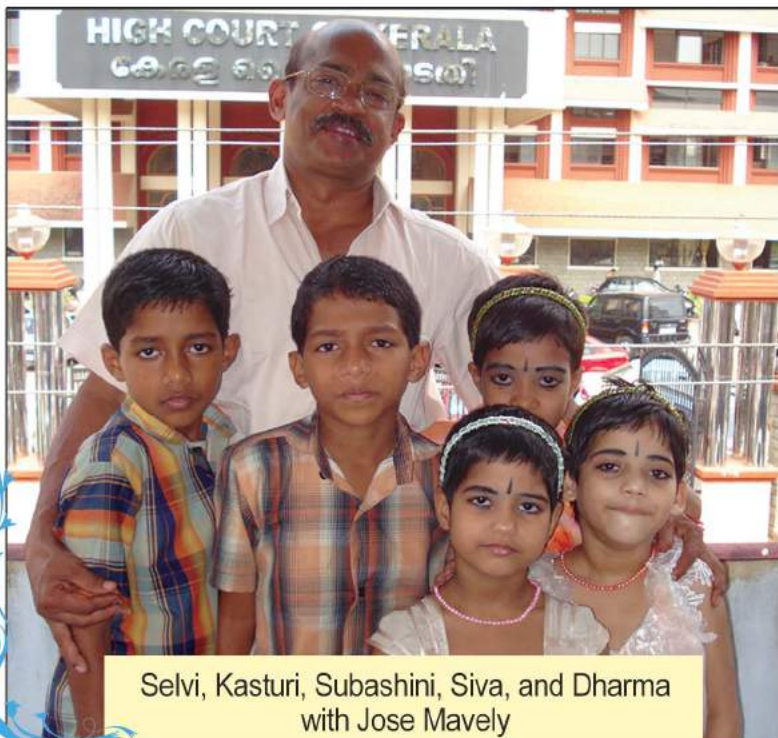

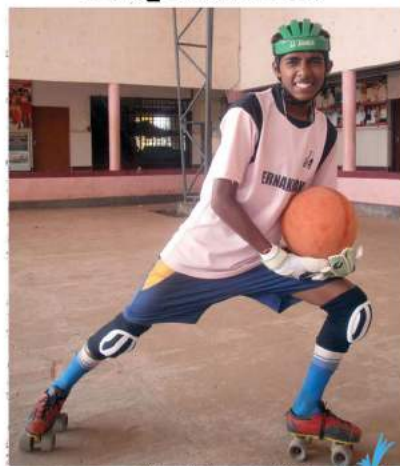
